APS Announces Request for Proposals for Alfred F. Kugel Estate

8/28/2023

Society Seeks Sale of Award-Winning Collection



The American Philatelic Society released a request for proposals (RFP) seeking firms to sell the Alfred F. Kugel Estate. Kugel, a retired investment counselor and noted philatelist, researcher, exhibitor, and leader in the hobby, died in 2022 at 91. The APS Board of Directors voted to induct Kugel into the APS Hall of Fame, and he was honored at the Great American Stamp Show in Cleveland. The solicitation is open to firms in the United

States and worldwide.

"We're grateful to Al and his wife, Dottie, for this incredible gift," said Scott English, Executive Director of the APS, "This estate is part of a new era for the APS and APRL."

The Kugel Estate comprises 69 boxes of philatelic material and 50 boxes of philatelic literature. The APS will offer the philatelic material for sale through the bid process. The philatelic literature will be transferred to the American Philatelic Research Library to be added to circulation or sold to members and the general public. An appraisal by Gerald Robbins of Robbins Stamps in Bellefonte, Pennsylvania, estimated the value of the philatelic material at \$1.79 million and the literature at \$12,000. The APS believes this is a floor, not the ceiling, for the realization of sales.

The APS outlined three goals for the sale of material:

- 1. Highest possible realization of sales of the Alfred F. Kugel Collection to support the mission and objectives of the APS and APRL.
- 2. Use the sale to promote the APS and APRL and their service to the international collecting community.
- 3. Honor the legacy of Alfred F. Kugel and his contributions to philately as a collector, exhibitor, researcher, writer, and friend.

IBRA Show Report

I attended the IBRA international stamp show in Essen, Germany on May 25-28, 2023. Essen is a city of about 500,000 people in northwest Germany, not far from the Netherlands border. The show was held in the convention center and consisted of two rooms, one for the bourse and another for the over 3.000 exhibit frames.

The most notable aspect of the show was the crowd. The bourse room was tightly packed, both with dealers and customers. For the first two hours of the show, it was nearly impossible to walk through the room. From then until Saturday mid-day, the bourse was full, as in the photo.

Deutsche Post had a big booth with lines of customers throughout the show. They had about 10 different show cancels, which you could select by dropping your item in the appropriate mail box. They also had a desk with staff members applying cancels on demand.

One thing I noticed was that a relatively large proportion of dealers had at least some of their stock offered by topic, 'motif' in German.

On the other hand, the exhibit hall was spacious and well lit. It was obviously impossible to see more than a small fraction of the exhibits. Sadly, the organizers didn't use any of that space to create a public seating area.


I saw a subsequent press release that claimed 10,000 visitors. Even with the continuous crowd, that seems high to me. On the other hand, no one could describe the turnout as anything but surprisingly good. There was no registration and no one counting people who entered – just stroll right in.

I had never been to a stamp show in Germany, but it was much like the ones I've attended in English-speaking countries.

Essen is a pleasant city, and there were plenty of shops, restaurants, and seemingly endless cafes. I was certainly glad I attended.

English added, "For the first time in over two decades, we can finally invest in the APS and the hobby, not debt retirement. We are financially sound and can now aggressively fight for the hobby's future."

As English outlined at the Joint APS/APRL Board meeting on August 9, 2023, the proceeds will go to the Joint Capital Fund established by the APS and APRL Board in November 2022. The JCF will finance the maintenance of the American Philatelic Center and technology investments to serve the membership better and build a younger and larger community of collectors.

Bids are due by October 1, 2023. The APS Board, in consultation with the APRL Board of Trustees and the Joint Finance and Audit Committee, will select one or more bids to begin the sale of the Alfred F. Kugel Estate. The APS expects a worldwide marketing campaign and sales to occur in no less than two years to realize the greatest return, promote the APS and APRL worldwide, and honor Al Kugel.
